ALUMNI OF DISTINCTION AWARDS

The purpose of the Campion College Alumni of Distinction Awards is to increase awareness of the array of successes and the breadth of influence of Campion College alumni, to promote the tradition of excellence of Campion College, and to honour alumni and former students who have not only distinguished themselves in their profession and in their community, but also demonstrate the core values of their Jesuit education in their professional and personal lives.

The 2011 Alumni of Distinction Awards will be presented on Friday, November 4, 2011.

ELIGIBILITY & SELECTION CRITERIA

- Nominees must be graduates of Campion College High School, or graduates or former students of Campion College at the University of Regina. Former students must have registered through Campion College for a minimum of one academic year.
- Nominees will have demonstrated the key characteristics of a Jesuit education—striving for more (*magis*), a deep respect for each individual (*cura personalis*), instilling leadership in service, and promoting justice—in their professional and personal actions.
- Nominees selected to receive the awards must attend the presentation ceremony (Friday, November 4, 2011) to receive the award, except in unforeseen circumstances, or agree to some form of presence through multi-media arrangements.
- The reputation, achievements and contributions of the nominees must bring honour and prestige to Campion College.
- Nominees will be sought from alumni, former students, faculty, staff and friends of Campion College.

Values of a Jesuit Education

The Jesuit approach to education begins with a respect for every person and a desire to develop leaders who are concerned about society and the world in which they live. Jesuit institutions are characterized by a common world-affirming outlook that seeks to prepare students for committed service as globally-minded and socially conscious citizens. The four key characteristics of a Jesuit education are:

- ***Striving for more (magis)***
This Ignatian characteristic encourages students to go beyond excellence to always choose the greater good, and strive to develop each element to the fullest. It is not simply about being the best in their class, but rather reflected in the individual's desire for constant improvement, the need to always go that extra step, striving for growth and open to change.

- ***Care for the whole person (cura personalis)***
Cura personalis aims at the development of the whole person—intellectually, spiritually, physically, and socially—while paying particular attention to the needs of the person. It manifests itself in the person who develops his/her gifts in service for others and demonstrates an ability to bring out the best in everyone.
- ***Leadership in service***
“Men and women for others.” Leaders in service are ones who display a genuine concern for society and the world in which we live, especially the marginalized, vulnerable and forgotten. They take on leadership roles not for personal gain, but to help advance their community and improve conditions for all.
- ***Promoting justice***
Graduates of a Jesuit institution develop a faith and worldview that fosters a disciplined and informed sensitivity to, and active concern for, human suffering and exploitation. They display a respect for all individuals and their basic right to fair and equal treatment. They are committed to justice and show a deep concern for the marginalized citizens of our society.

AWARD CATEGORIES

Awards are presented in two categories: professional achievement, and humanitarian and community service.

Alumni of Distinction Award for Professional Achievement

This award recognizes individuals who have distinguished themselves within their chosen profession, demonstrated the values, mission and philosophy of Campion College in their work, and applied the key characteristics of their Jesuit education to their professional and personal lives.

Alumni of Distinction Award for Humanitarian and Community Service

This award recognizes individuals who have dedicated their lives to improving their community and the lives of others through exceptional volunteer activity or humanitarian service in their profession. Recipients will thus have demonstrated the values, mission and philosophy of Campion College and the key characteristics of their Jesuit education in their actions.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

The selection committee will be comprised of:

- Dean, Campion College
- The Director of Communications & Admissions
- A representative from the Jesuits
- One member of the Campion College faculty
- Two Campion alumni/former student (university or high school)

PROCEDURE FOR SUBMISSION OF NOMINATIONS

1. Submission of a nomination package, which includes:
 - a. Completed nomination form
 - b. Biographical sketch of the nominee
 - c. Executive summary, indicating why this candidate is deserving of the Campion College Alumni of Distinction Award, including how they demonstrate the key values of their Jesuit education in their professional and personal actions.
 - d. A release form signed by the nominee to:
 - i. Let his/her name stand in nomination; and
 - ii. Agree to attend the presentation ceremony if selected to receive the award
 - e. Additional supporting documents, such as a list of awards of public recognition, sample media reports, letters of reference, etc.
